Delivering care means delivering our best. At the Missouri Poison Center, we put our commitment to quality into action by adhering to best practices in care and training. We regularly review our guidelines to ensure their accuracy and adherence to current standards. Our team of registered nurses and pharmacists undergo rigorous training to become Certified Specialists in Poison Information (CSPI). Our Physician Medical Toxicologist consulted on 1,148 exposures throughout 2023 alone.

The outcome: prevention of unnecessary visits to the emergency department, significant healthcare savings, expanded education about critical poisoning and overdose risks, lives saved and transformed.

KIDS AND CANNABIS: A TOXIC COMBINATION.

Accidental pediatric exposure to cannabis continued to rise in 2023, largely due to the ingestion of palatable edibles. The state and nation have turned to the Missouri Poison Center for answers. Cannabis safety stakeholders have sought out our perspective on packaging to reduce accidental pediatric exposure, and substance use coalitions are using our cannabis tip sheet in their educational programs. Together, we can weed out the risk of cannabis to kids.



EXPANDING EDUCATION.

The Missouri Poison Center believes in learning for life-specifically, education designed to save lives from poison exposures. We offer educational programs for the public, healthcare professionals and organizations via training, classes and meetings.

Public education

Our public education endeavors include working with teachers and students of all ages and partnering with substance use coalitions to educate the public about substance exposure, abuse and overdose. In fact, we were invited to participate in an collaborative summit addressing the fentanyl crisis in a larger metropolitan city, as well as take part in numerous substance abuse prevention programs. Other efforts include:

- Teaching at health fairs
- · Distributing educational materials and a monthly newsletter
- Partnering with county health departments, Safe Kids and other injury prevention coalitions
- · Presenting to various groups and organizations

Professional education

We are taking our world-class professional education worldwide. In addition to providing Missouri physicians, nurses, medical professionals and hospitals with toxin-related information, we also held a series of 13 training classes for poison centers in the U.S., Canada, and Puerto Rico. Other efforts include:

- Educational programs for licensed health care providers, medical residents, fellows in training, students from across medical disciplines, first responders, EMS providers, advanced pharmacy candidates and more
- Presentations on-site, at universities and at health care facilities throughout Missouri
- · Distribution of Poison Alert, our quarterly healthcare newsletter

Anyone can download our app for poison exposure information, first aid instructions and videos with no need for an internet connection. Our




